Plan view: an image of an object from above

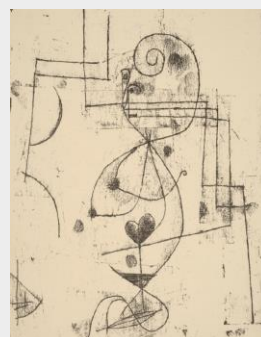
Human features: man-made objects

Science: Seasonal changes




- There are **4** seasons every year.
- Autumn, Winter, Spring and Summer.











